As you will see on the next page, we had a net gain of \$210,642 last year; however, we must consider these unique factors in evaluating our overall situation:

- In March 2021 we received a second Payday Protection Program Loan for \$204,623 for which we did not budget. While we are hopeful this loan will be forgiven, we cannot guarantee that it will be. We may need to pay all or part of it back. This loan is the single biggest contributor to our gain last year.
- We conducted two unplanned appeals last year, one via personal email from Father John and the second, our "A Promise of Hope and Healing" campaign. These two appeals brought in more than \$100,000 for which we are extremely grateful.
- School income was below budgeted by more than \$125,000. While enrollment is improving, we are still well below pre-Covid enrollment levels. This significant loss was offset by higher than expected church income as described above.
- This year we have budgeted for an annual loss of more than \$175,000. This number is primarily driven by returning to nearly full parish/school operations and staffing, with continued lagging school enrollment income.

Pastoral Council

Our Pastoral Council serves as an advisory board to Father John. St. Vincent de Paul Society

As a parish, Queen of Peace is committed to giving the first portion of what we receive to those in need. We designate 2 percent of offertory income to the Queen of Peace Conference of St. Vincent de Paul. The tithe for the 2020-2021 year was **\$13,869.00**.

In addition to providing generously for the traditional works of the St. Vincent de Paul Society, some of the parish tithe has also directly helped parish families who found themselves in extremely difficult circumstances this year. Other areas of assistance include medical and transportation needs, utility assistance, educational aid, and food and hygiene needs.

The Adopt A Family Christmas program for children helps many parishioner and area families provide gifts to children and food to families at Christmas. Our Comforter of the Afflicted program helps those in need following a death.

Our Parish Investment in Queen of Peace School

We began our Parish Community in 1957 when forty families gathered for their first Mass as Queen of Peace parishioners. The Mass was celebrated by Father Milford Bell (our first pastor) in the gym of Twin Branch School. One year later the school and rectory were built, and the school opened with a first year enrollment of 120 students (1-8 grades) under the leadership of the Franciscan Sisters of Perpetual Adoration. In 1969 groundbreaking for the new church took place on May 4. Unfortunately in 1970 the school was closed, however the church was dedicated that same year by Bishop Pursley. Fast forward to 1999 with the re-opening of the school, enrolling students in preschool through second grade, with the intention of adding a grade per year until grade eight was reached. How far we have come as a parish community! We now have two classes of preschool and a thriving kindergarten through eighth grade.



Giving the Gift of Catholic Education

How would you like to give the gift of Catholic education to qualified families and receive tax benefits in return?

The Scholarship Granting Organization of Northeast Indiana (SGONEI) was founded in 2011 to provide low and middle-income families with scholarships to attend Catholic schools in the Diocese of Fort Wayne-South Bend. SGONEI is one of six approved Scholarship Granting Organizations (SGOs) in the state of Indiana, and was created to allow diocesan families to benefit from the Indiana Tax Credit Scholarship Program. SGOs were enacted in 2009, but were expanded as part of the 2011 Choice Bill that features a 50% state tax credit for contributions made to these SGOs. The funds donated can then be distributed to families who meet income and other requirements. SGO scholarships are funded by charitable corporate or individual private donations, not by the state.

Receiving a scholarship award from SGONEI is the first step for our eligible families to receive tuition funds through the Indiana School Choice Scholarship Program in subsequent years. These SGO awards must be funded by our parish and benefit students of Queen of Peace Catholic School.

To donate, go to <https://www.sgonei.org/> and click the blue "Donate Online" button. It will take you to the donation page where you will input your information. There are various options for payment including credit card, check, or stock transfer. You can also contact the Queen of Peace Business Office at 574-255-9674 for assistance. Following this process you will receive a letter with a Tax Credit Certification Number to use on your tax return. Donations must be received before December 31, 2021 to be eligible for 2021 tax benefits.

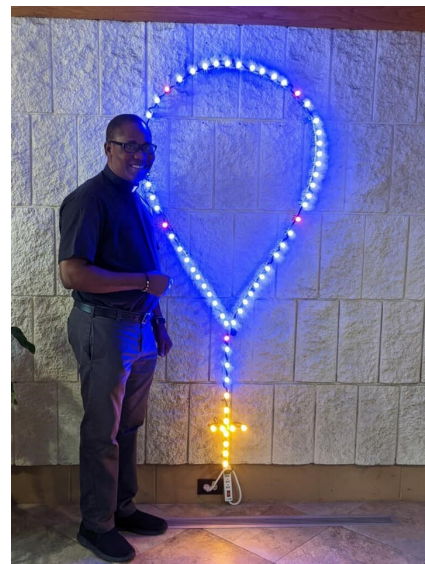
